Recognizing Yahoo Phishing Emails

- Look for urgent language or requests for personal data.
- Check for unusual activity alerts and urgent verification requests.
- Be wary of emails claiming you have won a prize or gift.

Actions to Take with Yahoo Phishing Emails

- Avoid Clicking Links or Opening Attachments
 - o Do not click on any links or open attachments in suspicious emails.
- Verify the Sender
 - o Check the sender's email address for subtle misspellings or unusual characters.
- Report the Email
 - o Forward the email to phishing@cc.yahoo-inc.com.
- Mark Emails as Spam
 - Use the spam icon in Yahoo Mail to mark the email as spam.
- Reset Your Password
 - o Change your Yahoo account password and enable two-step authentication.
- Educate Yourself
 - Learn about common phishing tactics and warning signs.
- Utilize Security Software
 - o Keep your antivirus software up to date to detect and block malware.

Examples of Common Yahoo Phishing Emails

- Fake Account Verification Email
 - Look for subject lines like "Urgent Action Required" and messages about unusual account activity.
- Prize or Gift Scam
 - Beware of emails congratulating you on winning a gift or prize and urging you to claim it quickly.

Personal Strategies for Avoiding Phishing Emails

- Identifying Red Flags
 - o Recognize common phishing signs like urgent prompts and suspicious links.
- Confirming the Sender
 - o Check for authentic email addresses with no misspellings or extra characters.
- Reporting Suspicious Emails

o Report emails to Yahoo and mark them as spam.

• Increasing Security

o Use strong, unique passwords and enable two-step authentication.

• Know that just opening an email can inform scammers that your email address is active.
