- Assess the newspaper's presence on social media. Does it actively engage with its audience?

5. Frequency of Updates

- Determine how often the site is updated with new content. Is it timely with breaking news?
- Look for special reports or weekly roundups. Does it offer regular updates on significant events?

6. User Experience

- Assess the website's design and navigation. Is it user-friendly and easy to browse?
- Check for mobile accessibility. Is the content easily readable on smartphones and tablets?
- Evaluate loading speeds. Does the site load quickly without excessive ads or pop-ups?

7. Subscription and Access

- Determine if the content is freely accessible or if a subscription is required. What are the costs associated?
- Look for transparency in subscription models. Are there free trial periods or limited access options?
- Assess the value of premium content. Is the additional information worth the cost?

8. Bias and Editorial Stance

- Identify any political or ideological bias. Does the newspaper clearly state its editorial stance?
- Look for a balance of perspectives. Are opposing views represented in the content?
- Consider the variety of opinions presented. Does it allow for diverse viewpoints on issues?
