

Guitar Maintenance Checklist

1. String Care

- Replace strings: Change them every 1-3 months or when they sound dull.
- Clean strings: Wipe down after each session with a microfiber cloth to prevent buildup.

2. Body Cleaning

- Wipe Down Body: Use a soft cloth to remove fingerprints and dust after each use.
- Polish: Apply guitar polish monthly to maintain the finish and prevent dirt buildup.

3. Fretboard Maintenance

- Clean Fretboard: Use a fretboard cleaner every few months.
- Condition Fretboard: Apply lemon oil (for rosewood or ebony) 1-2 times a year to prevent dryness.

4. Hardware Check

- Tighten Screws: Regularly check and tighten all screws on tuning pegs, pickguards, and bridges.
- Check Tuners: Ensure tuners hold the string tension without slipping.

5. Neck and Action

- Check Neck Relief: Inspect the neck's curvature and adjust the truss rod if needed.
- Adjust Action: Set string height for comfort and playability. Consult a technician if unsure.

6. Electronics

- Test Electronics: Regularly check pickups, knobs, and switches for proper function.
- Clean Pots: Use contact cleaner to keep volume/tone pots and switches static-free.

7. Storage

- Proper Storage: Store in a case or on a stand to avoid accidental damage.
- Humidity Control: Keep the guitar in a controlled environment, ideally between 45-55% humidity.

8. Tuning Stability

- Check Intonation: Ensure each string plays in tune across the fretboard.
- Tune Regularly: Use a tuner to maintain accurate pitch before each play.
